

2017 Communication: the future of food and farming

- Need for growth and jobs in rural areas to remain attractive living places
- Structural issues:
 - lack of attractive employment opportunities
 - underinvestment in connectivity
 - significant youth drain

CAP post-2020: new delivery model

- *From compliance to performance*
- *No detailed measures, reduced EU requirements*
- *Streamlined CAP plans*
- *Integrated and innovative approaches favoured*



CAP post-2020: rural development interventions



KEY FEATURES

Minimum budget ring-fencing of **total EAFRD** contribution:

- **30%** for interventions addressing the three environmental/ climate objectives
- **5%** for LEADER

Possibility of using **financial instruments** (incl. working capital), also in combination with grants

Digitisation strategy, YF strategy, Risk Management Strategy to be included in the CAP plan



New rural value chains: bio-economy

Great potential in terms of growth and jobs

Contributes also to

- resource efficiency
- the production of clean energy
- reduction of food waste

More active role by primary producers needed
